## TACO DINNER

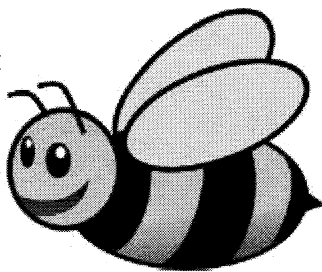
FRIDAY, 31<sup>st</sup>
